APPENDIX C

In accordance with KRS 36.224, the Office of Homeland Security has compiled the following report of homeland security federal awards received in Kentucky. Since the Statute does not define "homeland security federal funds" the Office of Homeland Security relied on the U.S. General Accounting Office, (GAO) and the Catalog for Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) for guidance in identifying DHS funds.

Several funding programs previously assigned to the Federal Emergency Management Assistance (FEMA) and the Department of Justice have been cataloged under the U.S. Department for Homeland Security under the new agency number 97 in the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance. Further, numerous new initiatives have been added to the catalog. For a complete list of federal homeland security funding programs visit our website at <http://homeland.ky.us>.

Use caution when reviewing this report for "NEW" federal funding. Several of the programs listed in this report were in existence prior to the establishment of the U.S. Department for Homeland Security. However, in many instances, large sums of federal dollars have been added to existing programs to implement homeland security initiatives. For example, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services funds Bio-terrorism Hospital Preparedness Programs through the Public Health and Social Services Emergency Fund; and the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) has provided overtime pay for security personnel during Operation Liberty Shield. Further, funds that were previously earmarked for other projects have been diverted to homeland security initiatives.

This report includes funds being expended in FY 2004 that were awarded in previous years. The "Grant Period" column must be taken into account when viewing the "Total Adjusted Award" amounts. The U.S. Department for Homeland Security is working toward having "a single point of contact" for terrorism and emergency preparedness efforts – a single access point to obtain critical grant funding. One central point of contact coupled with the federal governments new Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS), that will be used for tracking purposes, will provide the information needed to deliver a more user friendly homeland security funding report in the future. Since this is the first year for the DUNS number requirement, tracking benefits are not yet available.

For the FY 2005 report, the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security will work with the Legislative Research Commission on minor adjustments to timelines, to allow the process to align with existing reporting programs, thereby avoiding duplication in reporting efforts, and more accurate reporting.
